New Telephone System

We are pleased to announce that we will be moving to a new telephony system in the next few months!

The new system has a ring back feature which will allow patients who are in a long queue, the ability for us to call you back when you reach the end of the queue.

This will save you valuable time and money.

At present, our staff are not able to answer calls from home if they are not able to get in. The new system allows staff to answer calls anywhere private which will help with business continuity. Patients will know it's the surgery calling as the main number will show up. The phone system integrates with our clinical system, so will help with keeping patient demographics up to date.

All calls are recorded which will be good for training. We will keep you updated and hope there will be minimal disruption.

Social prescribing explores what matters to you, we create a plan together & empower you to take control over your situation, helping to link you to services to enable positive life changes.


The personalised support can be delivered over many appointments, giving the time and confidence to work on the underlying issues which are affecting your overall health and wellbeing


Eligibility criteria 18+

- Financial, Housing, debt & benefit issues

- Practical Help (cleaning/shopping)
- Long term health conditions, Long Covid & Low-level addiction & recovery
- Learning, voluntary & employment opportunities
- Lifestyle support/ weight management
